MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

EXCEPTIONAL GROWTH

As I look back on this year, I realize that some of our most significant growth has been in our community clinics.

Typically, our model is to form partnerships with schools, shelters and social service organizations, which allow us to take health care into their walls and reduce the typical barriers that the poor and underserved face in accessing primary health care services. Those barriers are transportation (we come to where they live and gather); cost (our model of partnership reduces or eliminates the out-of-pocket expense to the patient); and trust (by building upon the trust that the host agency has with their clients).

With this model, our services are limited to the students or clients our partner agency serves. But there are exceptions.

In 2001, our clinic in Hancock Place School District served anyone who lived in the district (defined as the 63125 zip code) at no out-of-pocket expense.

In 2009, our Vietnamese clinic in partnership with Catholic Charities Southside had no geographic limitations, but it was limited to Vietnamese patients coming through the CCSS support program.

Around 2015, our clinic at Epworth Children and Family Services Teen Drop-In Center served all youth ages 11-21 coming through the Center.

In the past year, we have seen additional “exceptions” in the form of our Community Connections Clinic—providing services to those within a four-mile radius of the Bridgeton Landfill. In addition, our community clinic in the Youth and Family Center in the north downtown area serves those who seek services at YFC, and also those living, going to school, or seeking shelter in the surrounding neighborhood.

Perhaps this kind of broader community service is no longer an “exception” and maybe it never was. Our mission is to strengthen underserved communities one patient at a time. And through community partnerships, I am happy to say, we are continuing to meet this mission in fuller form and with wider reach.

Youth Family Center opens including a brand new IFM clinic.



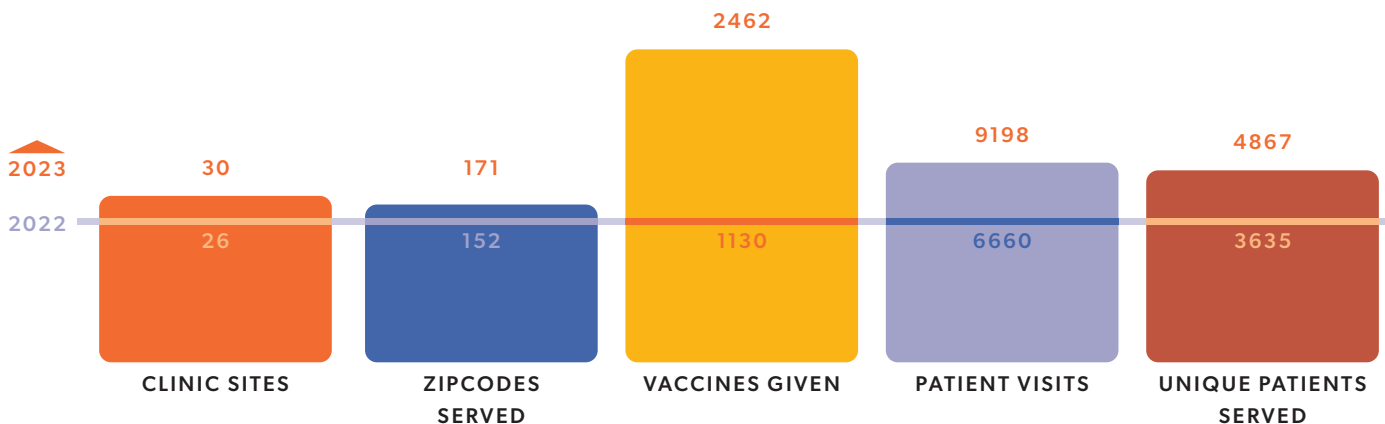
IFM expands its Community Health Worker program to help address clients with issues regarding social determinants of health.

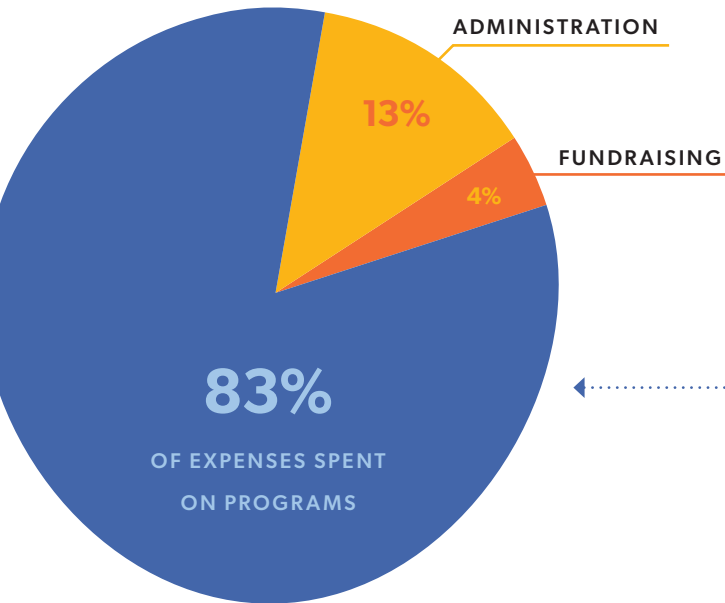

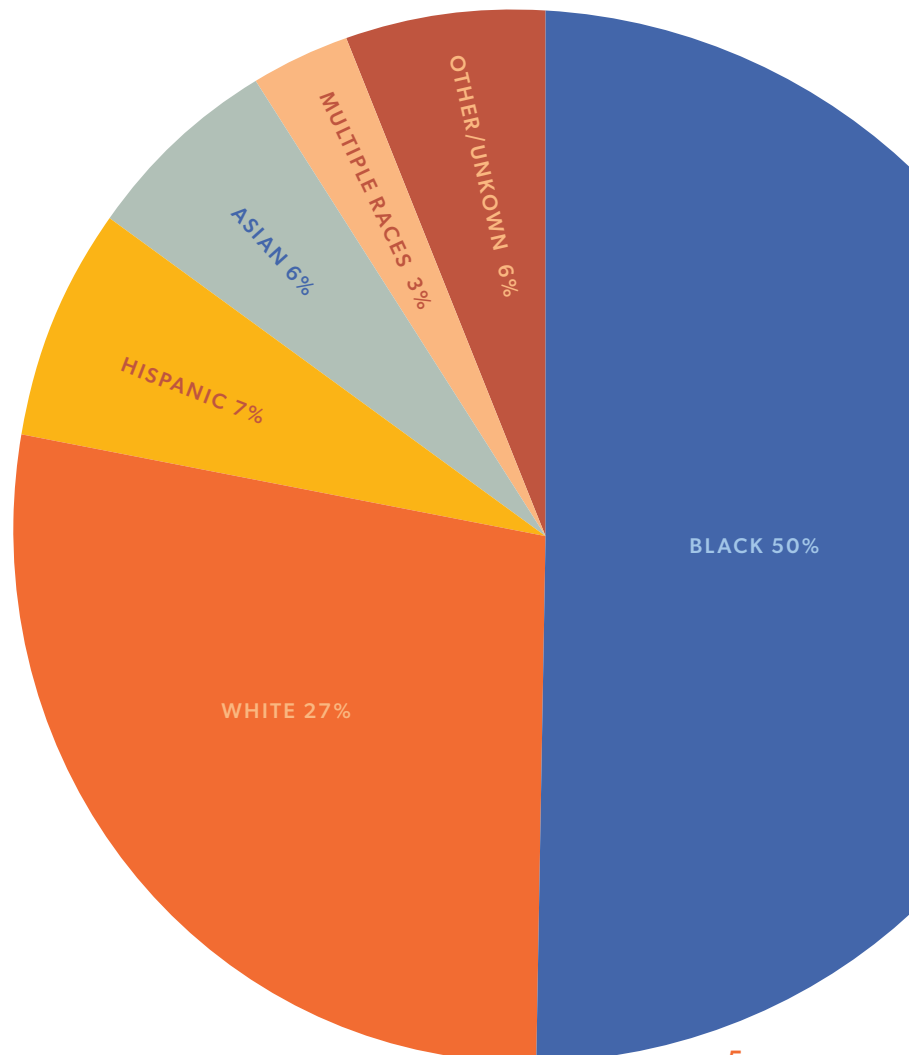
