It is once again that time of the year to report on the programs and progress of the Institute for Family Medicine for the most recently completed fiscal year. Formed in 1999, the organization has grown and evolved with a continued focus on developing community partnership to meet the primary health care needs of the underserved children, adults and seniors of the St. Louis Community.

During this past year, we welcomed new partners – Epworth Children and Family Services and St. Andrew’s Resources for Senior System.

Epworth Children and Family Services asked us to explore ways that we could provide medical care at their Teen Drop-In Center. This facility, open afternoons, was a place where adolescents can come to socialize, use the internet, get a hot meal – and with the partnership of IFM, seek medical attention.

St. Andrew’s operates a number of senior living facilities, and envisioned a program whereby their low income seniors with limited transportation options could access medical care in the same building as their apartment. The goal is to improve health care access and thereby reduce 9-1-1 calls, emergency room visits, and hospitalizations.

As we plan for the upcoming year, we prepare to welcome even more new partners with Hazelwood School District and Harris Stowe State University.

The work that we do through the Institute for Family Medicine is only possible because of the “**family**” that makes up IFM. The **family** of dedicated nurse practitioners, staff and board members and the **family** of supporters, volunteers, partners, and donors. I am honored to be able to be part of this and immensely grateful to each and every one that makes up the IFM **family**.

The Institute for Family Medicine’s caring doctors, nurse practitioners and nurses provide medical services for disadvantaged children, low-income families, the elderly and new Americans at more than a dozen locations throughout the greater St. Louis area. These patients need quality health care services, but struggle to navigate the traditional system due to lack of insurance, financial strain, difficulty accessing transportation, and language barriers. Many of our patients are also in transitional phases of their lives – homeless teens, women and children escaping domestic abuse, and refugees trying to find their way in a new country. We break down barriers to health care by taking our programs into the communities where children and families in need live, work, go to school and congregate.

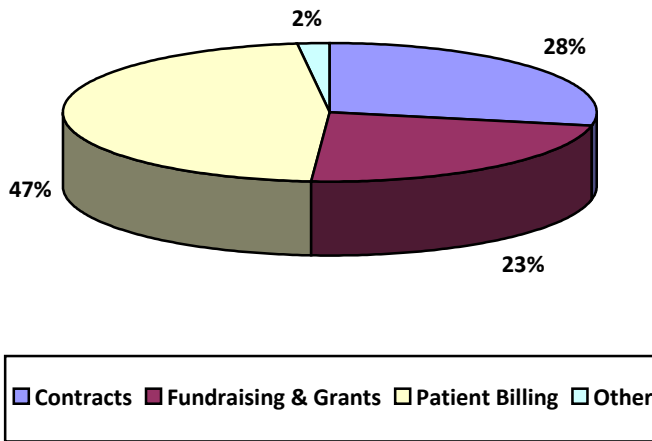

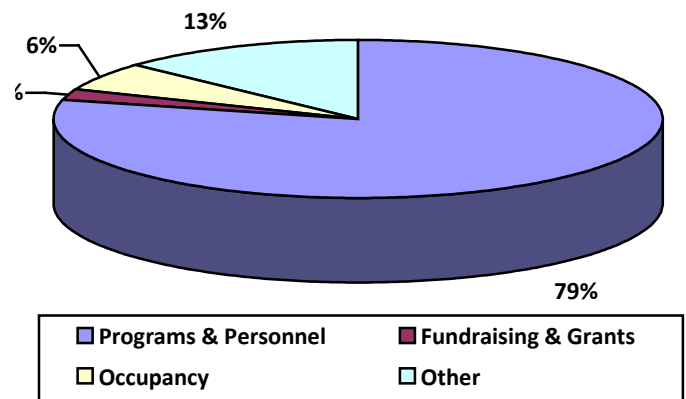
