A Message from our CEO

When IFM began in 1999, it was my vision to practice medicine in a way that would reach those who otherwise might not receive care. Jennings School District served as one of our first partners, and that is where we launched our Healthy Kids, Better Learners program. Simultaneously, I worked out of a traditional practice setting as well, seeing patients for many years.

Last August, I chose to split away from the traditional practice, and placed IFM's focus on our community clinics. Many of our partners have been by our side for years, and I have enjoyed working with each of them and the clients they serve. As an organization, we pride ourselves on our unique approach to community medicine. Working directly with our partners, in concert we determine where the barriers to care for their clients lie, and create our care model to address those issues. Result from this approach have yielded our ability to provide care to patients from as young as 12-days-old to 99 years.

While IFM has seen many changes over the last year, we have also seen growth. In January, we opened our clinic at St. Vincent's Home for Children. This summer, we were awarded a grant to begin our newest program, Kidney TLC, which addresses common risk factors for chronic renal disease. Thanks to our board, our donors, and our community partners, IFM's reach is growing. I look forward to being able to serve many more patients as we move into 2018 and beyond.

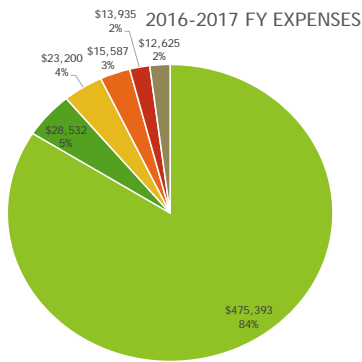

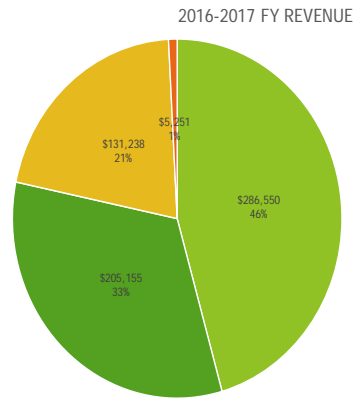

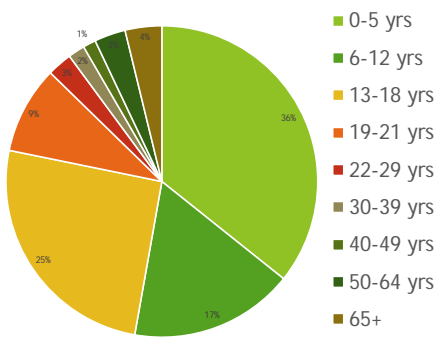

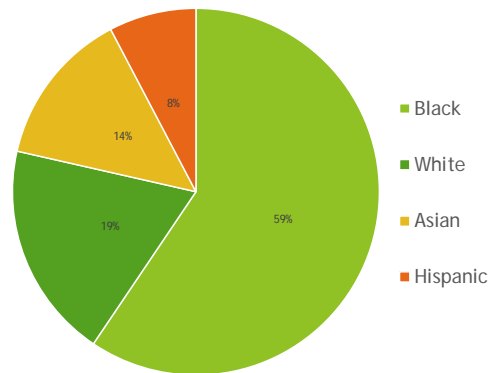

Age Distribution



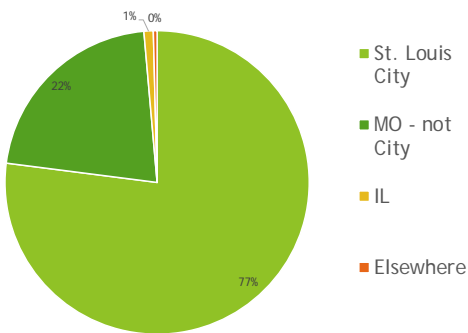

Racial Distribution



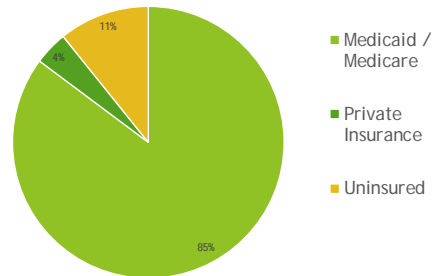

Geographic Distribution



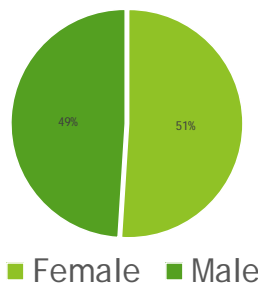
